THE POWER OF GRASSROOTS ORGANISATIONS

In many parts of the country, people have lost confidence in the possibility of a better future. Local control, self-determination, and the relationships that once defined local communities have been weakened by systems, structures, and decision-making that have taken power away from individuals.

We need to reclaim power at the local level by restoring the relationships that bind people together and nurture the bonds of solidarity that enable local action.

Grassroots organisations are the closest to the people and key to restoring community power. We are working with existing organisations to build a network of Social Action Hubs that will inspire and facilitate action at the grassroots. Working collectively we can amplify the stories of ordinary people making it possible for policy makers and those in power to hear those stories and understand the public demand for change.



WHAT IS A SOCIAL ACTION HUB?

Social Action Hubs are locally rooted organisations which are committed to training and supporting people to develop their understanding and practice of community organising.

They can be a single organisation or a cluster of organisations working together. They are dedicated to a local area, community or neighbourhood, accountable to local people and committed to igniting social change through community organising

They are guided by our Social Action Framework.
